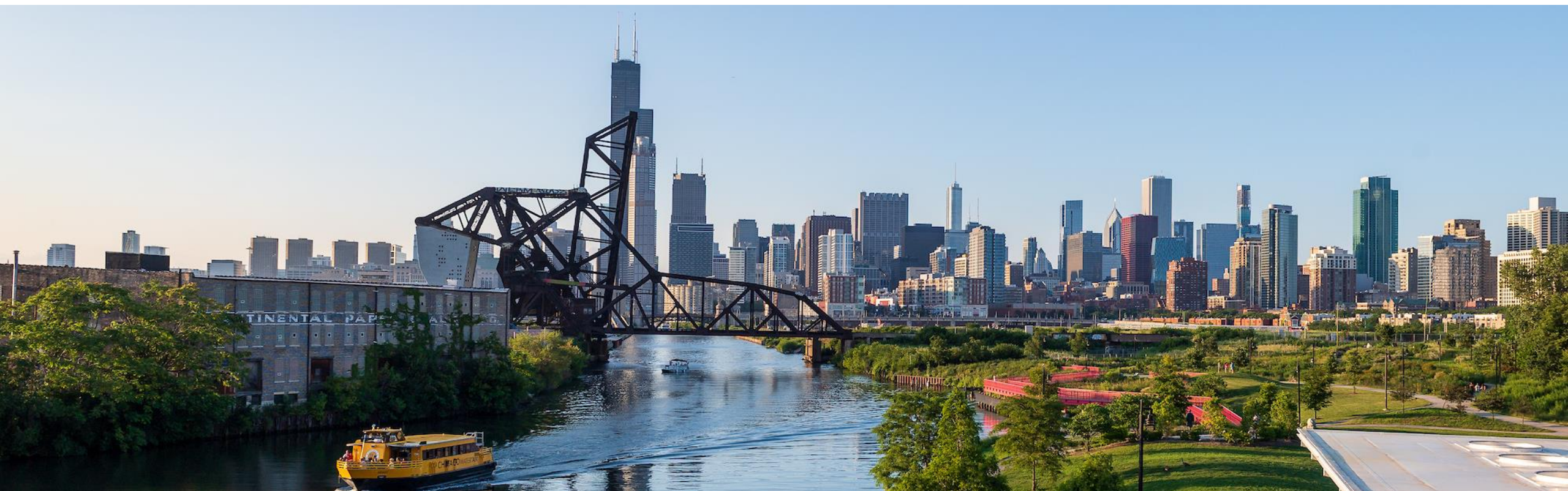
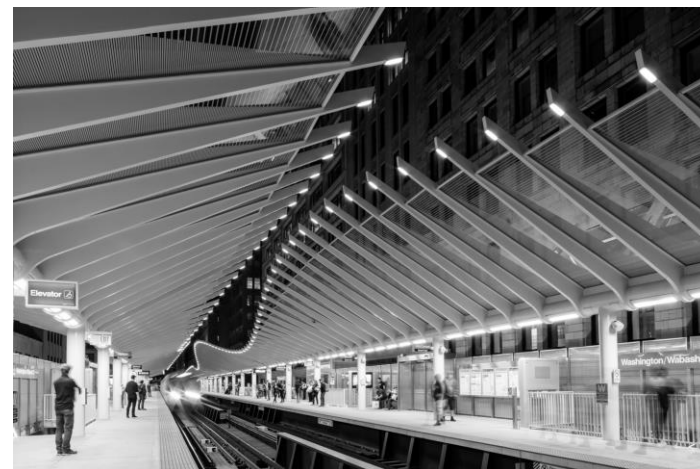

CUMULATIVE NUMBER OF CASES

UTILITY BILLING RELIEF

- 50% rate reduction for water charges, sewer charges and water-sewer tax.
- No penalties or debt collection on City of Chicago utility billing debt.
- Debt forgiveness after successfully completing one full year in the program.

FORWARD TOGETHER: RECOVERY TASK FORCE REPORT

The City's recovery task force—made up of over 200 industry experts, regional government leaders, community-based partners, and policymakers—just released an advisory report on how to transform the COVID-19 crisis into a once-in-a-generation opportunity to build a more equitable city.

OUTCOME #1: ADDRESS NEW AND OLD TRAUMAS

- Create the most advanced healing-centered region in the country
- Increase access to mental and emotional health resources and services in communities
- Create a culturally sensitive, diverse mental health workforce

OUTCOME #2: EXPAND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY, QUALITY EMPLOYMENT, AND FINANCIAL SECURITY

- Reimagine the region's workforce infrastructure and create a plan to invest in displaced and young workers
- Increase ownership and employment for Black and Brown residents in the regions' contracting and construction industries
- Create the most vibrant small and medium-sized business and Black- and Brown-owned business community in America
- Expand relief programs and pilot innovative approaches to improve and strengthen the social safety net

OUTCOME #3: BUILD ON OUR REGION'S STRENGTHS

- Expand the region's transportation, distribution and logistics sector by leveraging new trends in the localization of supply chains
- Strengthen Chicago's healthcare and life-sciences ecosystem
- Build on the region's assets in food and agriculture

OUTCOME #4: CAPTURE OPPORTUNITIES CREATED BY COVID-19

- Build on the region's historic strength in manufacturing
- Prepare the region to capture HQ2s and corporate development and specialty centers
- Capture film and TV production opportunities given the lack of studio space in California

STAY SAFE OUT THERE

If you need to go out for work, essential trips, or exercise, be sure to observe current public health guidelines.

GOING FOR A WALK, RUN, OR ROLL?

Plan before you go and avoid busy streets

Take your time and make room for others

Let people ahead of you know that you are coming up behind them

Use a face covering when physical distancing is not possible

Using a bike lane? Travel in the direction of traffic

Busy street? Return to the sidewalk

RIDING A BIKE?

Plan your route and avoid busy streets

Keep your distance from other bikers — at least one bike-length away

Use a face covering when physical distancing is not possible

Watch out for people walking, running & rolling in bike lanes and in the street

Let people ahead of you know if you're going to pass them ("on your left!")

When locking/unlocking to a bike rack, wait until others are done

Slow down or stop for people walking, biking, running, or rolling in the street

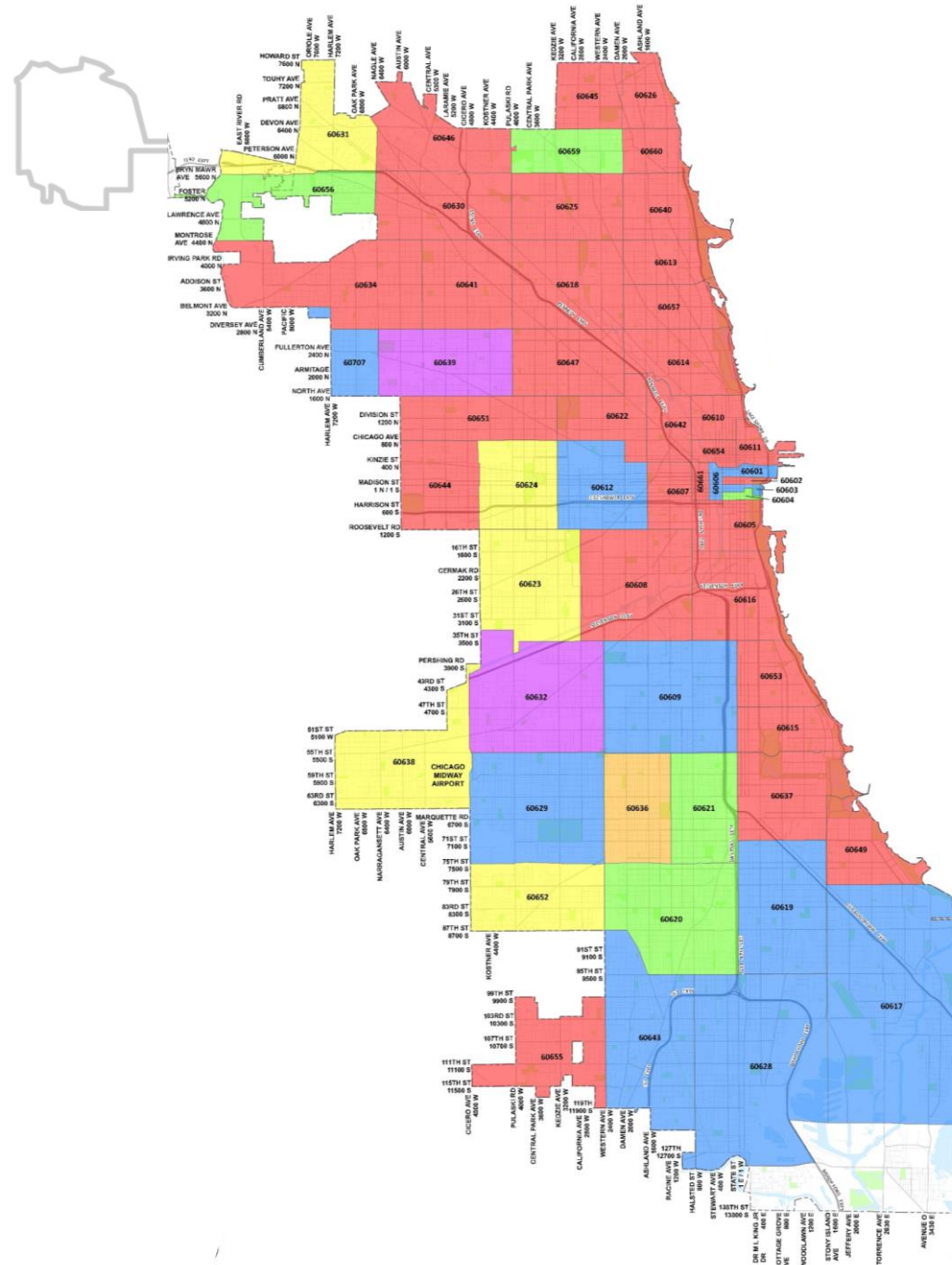
Do not park in the bike lane

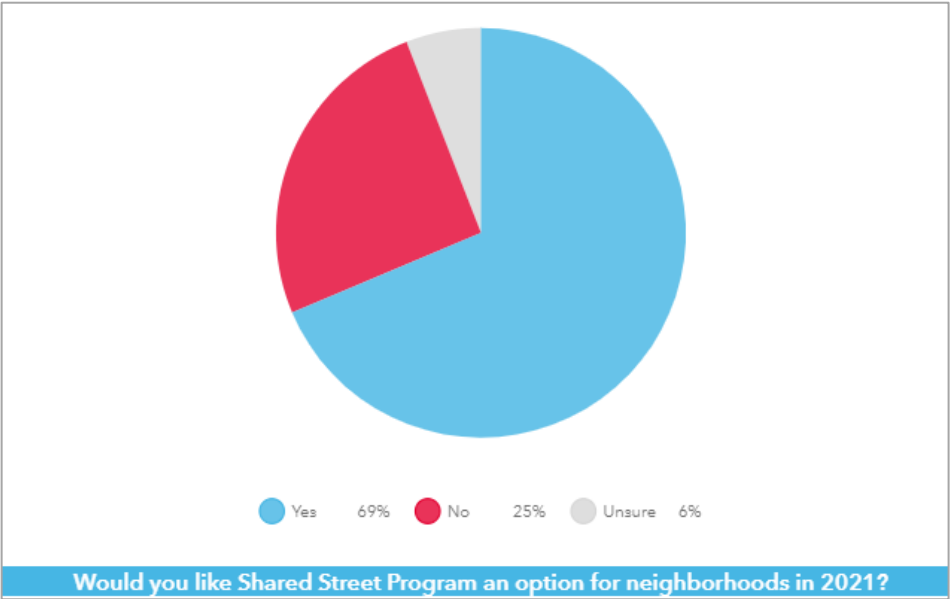
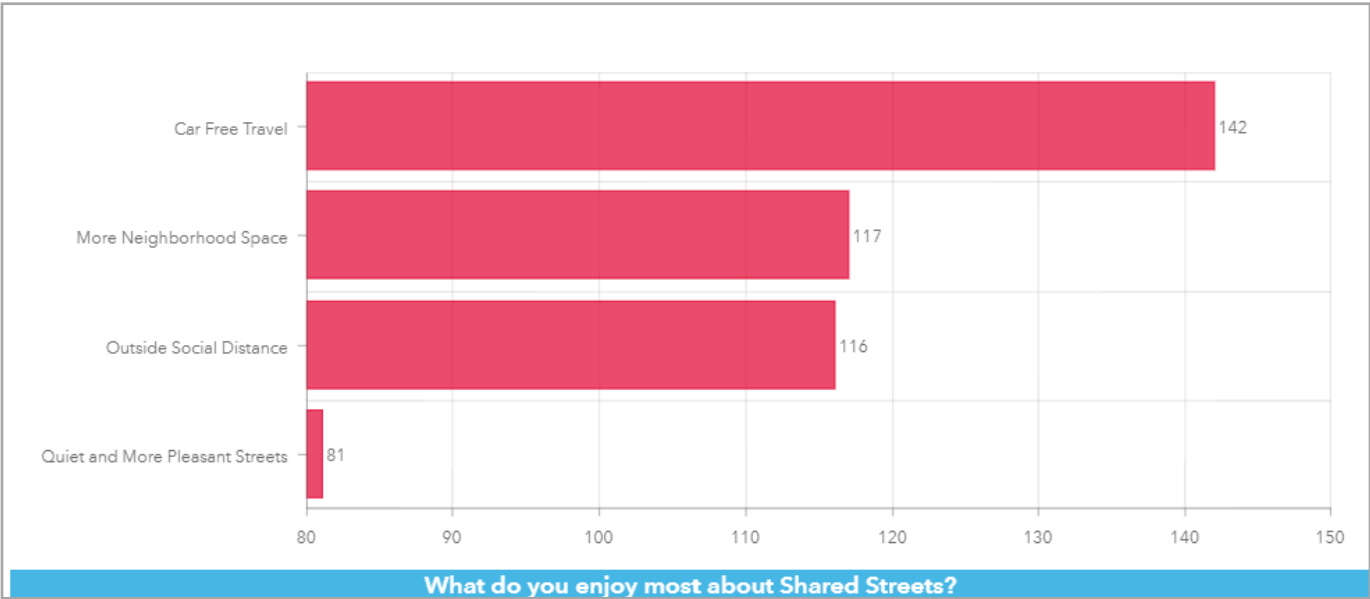

How much of a health risk do your employees associate with using the following modes of transport as the city reopens?



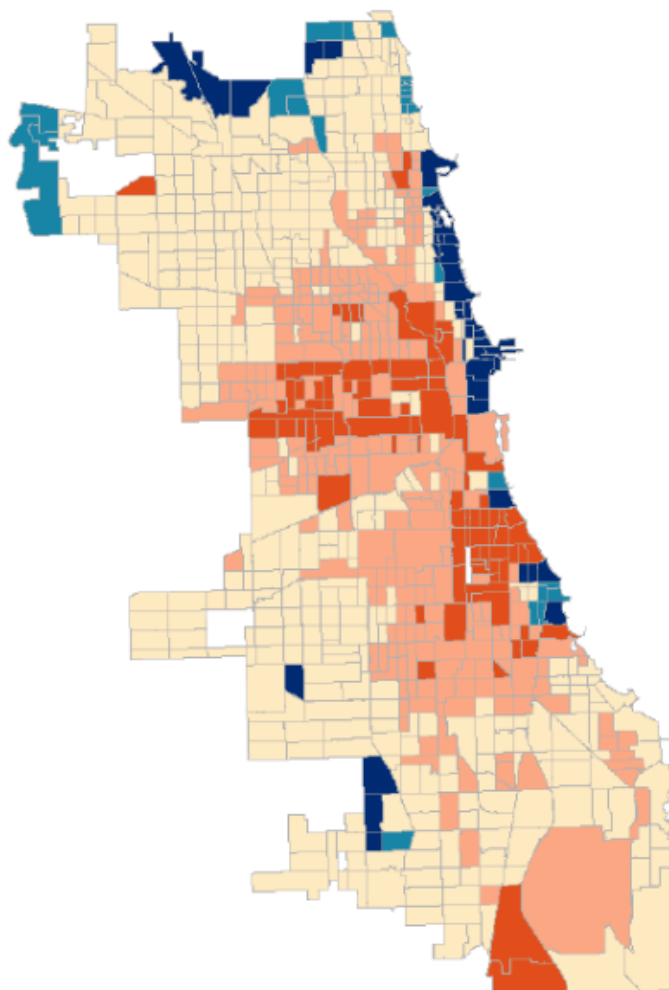

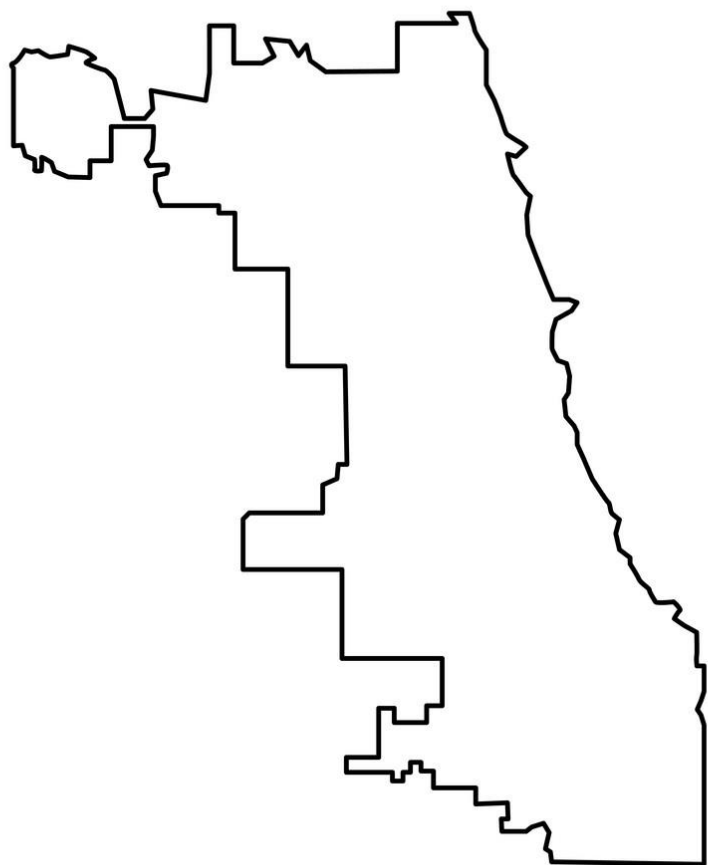
